

Pendle Hill Fund Year 3 Projects

Overview

The third window for applications opened on 3rd August for 6 weeks. This was postponed from the original planned application window in spring 2020 because of the Covid pandemic. The Community Engagement Officer advertised the Fund through social media, local contacts and local press beforehand, and was available to discuss potential project ideas with applicants before they submitted their final application. We were happy to receive community led applications even after the issues caused by the pandemic.

In total, the Fund received 3 project applications, of all of which were successful.

Projects

PHF3_001 – Sabden Parish Council: Calico and Clogs

Start date: October 2020

End date: October 2021

Pendle Hill Fund grant requested: £8887.50

Match funding offered: £2962.50

This project aims to develop and design a historic trail through Sabden using a mixture of information/interpretation boards and directional signs at key points of importance. The trail will inform visitors and village residents about local historical points of interest and will provide information on buildings, sites and events that are no longer visible.

PHF3_002 – Rimington Recreation Association: Rimington Heritage Trail

Final Pendle Hill Fund grant requested: £8421

Match funding offered: £936

The purpose of this grant is to bring the industrial and cultural heritage of Rimington to more people's attention through interpretation boards, online and printed routes. For a relatively small area Rimington has many old features however because of changes they are not all obvious. The various media envisaged will bring these to people's attention. The project will involve repairs and developments to current stiles and gates, to make the proposed heritage trail more accessible with fewer walking risks.

PHF3_003 – Heritage Trust North West: Habitat and Woodland Management at Park Hill

Final Pendle Hill Fund grant requested: £8000

Match funding offered: £23806

This project will aim to restore historic landscape features and habitats at Park Hill and make them a valuable resource for outdoor outreach and education with the local community. The work will include: management of existing woodland; manage footpaths and install interpretation panels for visitors; undertake new tree, hedgerow and scrub planting where appropriate in the site; stream and flood

management slowing the flow of the stream through the site; tackling invasive species; and run a series of events and workshops.
